When using 2 eggs, you may separate them. Add the yolks to the milk mixture. Beat the whites until stiff, but not dry and fold them lightly into the blended batter, after adding the milk and butter.

Add:

3 tablespoons of melted butter

1 to 1.25 cups milk

You can lightly grease the griddle or pan, and once heated over medium to medium high electric heat, they should take two to three minutes per side. One generally cooks them less on the second side, and one can generally flip them with a spatula the first time once the batter on top has begun to bubble quite a bit. Also where there is a lot of grain, some of it is used to feed livestock and poultry, so they have some of those items up north too. However, it takes quite a bit of energy to produce grain, so I am not sure how much grain we have in our reserves or not. Amtrak is suppose to deliver fresh produce up north from Florida, and as far as I can tell, we still have fresh produce. Also since it can sometimes be cold up north, we tend to have a lot of frozen foods, but it costs money to run a freezer. There are also a lot of canned foods up north, but they might come from warmer areas of the country. Of course there are a lot of dairy products up north too. We also have lots of potatoes, however we supposedly are running low on seafood, since the oceans are getting fished out. Some visitors from England told me in front of Mac Duff's that they are going to invade over here after they finish up in Iraq. I told them that there was not much here worth invading for. I chatted with some people warming up in the train station. I am not sure whether the trains are running regularly or not, since I do not see many people coming off the trains anymore. I stopped by CVS, and I looked at their circular. They have Nature's Bounty vitamins buy one get one free and CVS vitamins buy one get one 50% off. I am not sure if it is all types or not, so check www.cvs.com to make sure. I noticed one solitary dog walker walking a dog like in the TV show "The Thin Man". I think it is some sort of a bigger terrier, and I think they call it wired hair terrier. The one in the TV show "The Thin Man" was very smart, so I guess they are a smart dog. There were only a couple of people at www.starbucks.com, but the movie theatres looked active. Either that or people are just parking their cars downtown, since there is not much activity. I was asked about my Exxon cap at the Greenwich Library, and I explained that my father Louis Dale Scott built an oil refinery for Mobil oil www.exxon.com in Kaduna, Nigeria before retiring in 1982 and dying in 1989. I explained about the time I was born in Alton, Illinois he helped build an oil refinery in Wood River, Illinois for Shell oil www.shell.com . I also told them that somebody had built an oil refinery

near my Grandfather Clarence Scott's farm in Robinson, Illinois for Marathon Oil Marathon Oil Corporation which refined the oil from those old slow oil pumps in down state Illinois that yield about two or three barrels a day, but it adds up, and the Marathon oil refinery there is suppose to refine 350,000 barrels of oil a day most of which probably goes to farming in the Midwest. I also explained that in making ethanol from field corn, they have to use energy to dry the corn in the silos or it will get moldy, and not be useful. I guess that is why meat has gotten more expensive, because the same field corn can be used for feed grain for livestock instead of making ethanol. Ethanol is not that much cheaper here, but in the winter it generates less air pollution when mixed with regular gasoline at about 20% ethanol to 80% gasoline as I recall. I then put them in the Pyrex pie dish, and I baked them in the Farberware convection oven at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 35 minutes. I also made up a batch of http://www.geocities.com/mikelscott/mlsrice.htm to which I also added two teaspoons of Kikkoman soy sauce and Old Bay Seasoning and chicken bullion seasoning. I ate half, and I put the other half in a Rubbermaid container in the refrigerator. I also opened up a 26 ounce bag of Green Giant frozen corn, and I put about seven ounces in a plastic microwave proof pot with an inch of water and lid, and I heated it on two microwave vegetable cycles, and I then drained the hot water off of the corn, and I put the corn in a bowl with a little bit of olive oil. I ate it all with a glass of iced tea. I chatted with a relative. I have relatives who went skiing at Ski Vacation, Ski Tahoe, Ski Lake Tahoe, Squaw Valley USA, so I guess cold weather runs in the family. CIO

I took the small wooden oak folding table from the right side of the bedroom desk, and I move it behind the bedroom door. I think the other three folding oaks tables are underneath the bedroom on the right side. I moved both of the DeLonghi oil filled radiators which I did not have to use this winter from the hallway entrance area leading off the living room, and I moved them to the right side of the bedroom desk with the Epson Stylus 900 printer sitting on top of them with my old mail on top of that. One of these days, I will have to sort through my old mail. We might yet get a cold spell, so I will still leave my hats, scarves, gloves on the back of the down sofa, and I will still leave my long underwear hanging in the hallway. Since I am use to colder temperatures, and since I have a westerly exposure with a lot of sun light in the warmer months, my apartment can get too warm starting around the first of May. I leave the General Electric Profile 15,500 BTU air conditioner installed year round, and I insulate it and cover it up in the winter. However, it only takes about a half hour to uncover it and have it available for use when needed. I have the General Electric Service contract paid up on it until September 12, 2007 which costs about a \$100 a year. Its moving louvers do not work, but it seemed to work otherwise fine last season. The Honeywell Tower fan on its right side would probably be good at moving around its cooled air a little bit more, since the moving louvers do not work. It slides out of its case for service. There are two screws on either side of the lower front sides that have to be removed to slide it out the unit from its case housing. Its outside housing is installed with support brackets to support the heavier unit. It cost about \$600 at Partridge and Rockwell 5 years ago, and it runs just fine. It is high energy efficiency made in South Korea. I think I cleaned the filter before closing it up this past winter. I just put a Frost King foam filter over its factory installed filter, so I can clean it. The new foam filters which I have a spare one have cost a few dollars. Obviously with the computers running I have to keep the apartment in the summer at about 78 degrees Fahrenheit. All of the computers have extra case fans for keeping them cool too. CIO

I thus installed I think it was a 50 AMP circuit breaker in the basement circuit breaker box, and then carefully connected the ground and two wires from the garage apartment into the basement circuit breaker box while it was still electrified which was a bit dangerous, but I was able to tighten the 50 AMP circuit breaker clamp down screws with a heavy insulated screw driver, so I was not electrocuted. They did not want to pay for a professional electrician. It does look appealing to me, since it has four engines which I consider safer than Boeing: Commercial Airplanes - 787 Home which seems to only have two engines. I worry about a jet with only two engines, if one fails on take off, it might not get off the ground. However, this old model Boeing: Commercial Airplanes - 747 Home does have four engines. This was always my favorite Factsheets: B-52 Stratofortress: B-52 Stratofortress because it had eight engines, and they were sure to deliver. I already had strong Chinese connections before I met them, since I grew up around Claire Channault's people down south in Florida and Alabama. We use to have a Chinese neighbor in Alabama that taught piano lessons. I also went to the Taft School The Taft School with a few prominent Chinese Americans. We were Ambassador Bush's family's neighbors here in Greenwich, Connecticut when he was the first U.S. Ambassador to China. I left www.lfc.edu with Hurley Haywood who was General Haywood's grandson who was the first American General to deal with Mao Zedong - Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia. The last time I chatted with http://mikelouisscott.com/fred.htm, he had a Chinese roommate named John going to Columbia University www.columbia.edu and Fred was reading 600 year old books in Chinese, I presume from the Morgan Library The Morgan Library & Museum, New York, founded by Pierpont Morgan or the Kress Collection Samuel H. Kress Foundation. Maybe Fred Von Mieres is Frederick W. Note:<888> 03/20/07 Tuesday 5:00 A.M.: I also put a double layer of 5/8th inch thick sheet rock on the outer inside apartment walls to keep it warmer. I recall I did not use the old rusted iron pipes leading to the garage through the solid block of concrete. I ran new copper pipes from the basement through the bathroom sub floor into the bathroom and the kitchen area. I was able to find a 5 inch PCV adapter to thread into the existing sewer connection in the basement for the sewage pipe to lead into instead of a cast iron pipe and lead seal. The PCV pipes should hold, and I used plumbers cement on the 5 inch PCV adapter into the sewer pipe. Hopefully they never got any sewer gas in the basement. I recall the previous owner of the house in the 1930s was a German puppet maker or marionette maker. That is a wood doll on strings. I saw a lot of people in the area that looked German, but Manhasset was founded by the Dutch and had a Dutch Reform church, so there could have been Dutch in the area. There was even a Harlem Savings Bank named after Harlem in the Netherlands. One of the last things I did was plant tulip bulbs, so since it was late in the season, I was surprised they came up the following spring. I use La Paz pebbles on the sidewalk surface which is similar to the aggregate around the Waldorf Astoria in Manhattan, so hopefully the current residents never slipped on the sidewalk. Possibly they wore off over time. J.B. had the terracotta tile taken off the bedroom room and replaced with asphalt, since it was to expensive to replace the terracotta tile. I think the primary garage of living room and kitchen space also had a terracotta roof as did the main house, and that was a lot of weight on the garage. Also I cut a vent in the end of the garage attic for ventilation in the summer, and I put a box ban up there, since they could not afford a regular attic exhaust fan. I installed a small door on it that one could close in the winter to keep the place warmer, but it was hard getting into the attic since there was not enough room in the ceiling joists to put in a folding attic stairs, one had to climb up on a ladder through a trap door, which I as able to do back in 1983. Since I was working that entire period except a day off at Christmas, I did not know much of what else was going on in the world. That following spring, after going to Norway, where they had six feet of snow on the ground when I arrived a couple of weeks before St. Patrick's Day, which somehow melted in a few days while I was there, I stopped by to visit the garage apartment briefly and see J.B. before I returned to

Michael the bartender at the Fogarty house was also the bartender at the Languedoc in that period, so I think they got their Michaels mixed up. Just like I was suppose to know the Grannis family from Lake Forest, Illinois in Nantucket, and I ended up working for the Grennons from Concorde, Massachusetts and Stowe, Vermont. CIO

Note: <888> 03/20/07 Tuesday 4:15 A.M.: I recall using over 50 fifty pound bags of Secrete concrete mix to build the foundation wall for the garage apartment bathroom, the foundation wall for the north wall of the garage that the old garage door sits on that was caulked and filling in the gaps around the 4" by 4" inch pressure treated base sill of the garage apartment that the studs sat on, and at some points where the exterior wood was eaten away by termites, underneath the outside stucco which was about the only think holding up the garage, I also filled it in with concrete. I think I used another 25 bags or more of Secrete concrete to construct the entrance stairs, and the small side walk leading of the smaller side walk around the back side of the house. I can not do anything about the noise from the commuter train, but time might fix that, since there is an old wooden railroad trestle on the west side of Manhasset leading towards the next town west over a valley, and since it was built in the late 19th Century, some day it might need to be replaced. However, I do not think many of the commuters notice it in their daily rides. My Uncle from Texas and my recently diseased Aunt lived in the next town west during World War II, when he was in the Merchant Marine. J.B. said that town was all Hebrew people, but I do not think my Aunt and Uncle were Hebrew. CIO

Note:<888> 03/20/07 Tuesday 3:35 A.M.: I installed the XP Professional updates on the two desktop PCs in the living room, and of course the third Desktop PC in the living room had Vista Ultimate. I also installed the XP updates on the Toshiba laptop that has XP Home. They all seem to be running fine. I do not leave the FIC computer running anymore, since I am running the server off the Epox computer. However, the Epox computer takes so few hits, I am wandering whether I should bother running it anymore, and just leave the Geocities Server going at http://geocities.com/mikelscott/. I noticed today on the Epox stats Summary

(Michael Louis Scott's web site) under Recent Visitor Activity [Michael Louis Scott's web site] that a couple of people looked at this old web page Rope, Hemp, Cannibis, Marijuna in North America Expose. I can assure you I do not smoke hemp or marijuana. If you looked at my over 10,000 pages of information and web logs on my server, it is obvious that I have been keeping busy with my volunteer activity for the last 11 years or so that I have been on the internet. Possibly someone is interested in getting rope for a large boat. My research on the subject was sketchy, and I am not a botanist. I have a friend that is more of an expert on botany, but alas he has been quite scarce for the last few years, so possibly he is busy with other matters. He is known my the nickname J.B., but alas he last showed up here with Virginia license plates on his car, and since his father worked for the United States government state department, I figured he probably got a job in government, so he does not like chatting with unemployed civilians anymore. Whatever, the case, I am sure there are some Chinese keeping an eye on him, because of his family's Chinese connections, where ever he might be. There are 50 million Chinese living outside of China, so unlike the U.S. Government Intelligence agencies with about 50 thousand people, the Chinese frequently know more, they just never tell anyone anything, since by the forces of numbers they see more around the world. J.B.'s maternal grandfather was a Canadian geologist that explored North America for the oil companies in the old days, so he knew quite a bit about geology and the layout of North America. His maternal grandmother's family owned John G. Simmons insurance company that insured the oil refineries in the New York area, and they lived in a neighborhood out in Plandome Manor, Long Island, New York, where there was a Getty gasoline station nearby in Manhasset, Long Island, his maternal grandmother's family the West family were the first United States ambassadors to Saudi Arabia, so the Arab Sheiks use to visit Plandome Manor in the late 1940s, and possibly even the Getty family might have had a home out there. The Plandome Manor area looks sort of like the Millbrook area of Greenwich, Connecticut, but Plandome Manor only has a train station the second to the last stop on the Port Washington line of the Long Island railroad with a small post office. Since his maternal great grandmother's family were part of the Kaiser of Germany's consular staff in Manhattan before World War I, I built the garage apartment interior renovation, but I tried to treat the place like an embassy trying to regard any historical details that might have been intact in the house. John was most proud of the Japanese Maple? version of the tree that blooms in North America at Easter time with the four white petals with the red cross formed on the white petals. They were also very common in the American version down south. We did cut off a section of the old apple tree which was rotten, but half of it was still growing. I advised them not to get rid of the old oil furnace, since it seemed to be a classic well made machine if properly maintained. It put out so much heat the basement was always warm, and I put a fan in the canning room in the basement adjacent to the garage apartment vent, to blow the heat from the basement into the garage apartment. Knowing Vivian vacationed in Tobago, and knowing that I met J.B. down in Key West, I figured they wanted the garage apartment to be warm. I put a foot of insulation on the north wall of the garage apartment building it out into the interior. I put a foot of pink Owens Corning

insulation also in the attic. I put 2 inch thick Styrofoam underneath floor in between the joists. I put regular 3.5 inch thick insulation around the rest of the walls. I caulked all of the air leaks around the old garage with 20 year guaranteed caulk. I also put storm windows on the door and the windows. The garage also had a 25 foot long heavy cast iron steam radiator, which I partially covered with a shelf with ventilation around it. I also found a new bleeder valve for it at Wright Brother's Hardware store in Manhasset, Long Island, so if the garage apartment is still intact, it should be a very warm 500 square foot garage apartment for someone from a warmer climate. The former father was also stationed in Thailand, so obviously he knew other people from warmer parts of the world. I also put a six foot long electric base board heater in the bedroom. There was a through the wall air conditioner from Sears. The only problem with the apartment that I knew was they were on a limited budget, so they would not let me put in water proof plywood on the apartment floor before the carpet was laid, except in the bathroom and possibly the kitchen area, so if the composite flooring on the main living room and bedroom floor got wet, it might deteriorate very fast. However, I anticipated that problem, so when I installed the base boards and molding, I left them about 5/8 inch above the floor, so the composite wood could easily removed and replaced with water proof plywood. I think the flooring was tacked down with wood screws too. Also when I took down the old plaster, I put in new termite proof pressure treated 4 inch by 4 inch footings around the exterior of the building connecting them to the 2" by 4" studs with angle irons, and also parts of the base of the studs had to be replaced because of termite damage, so if the apartment roof settled anymore, it would be on a firm foundation. I also added cement to fill any voids along the footings. The house obviously had major termite damage in the garage, but I am not sure about the main part of the house. The garage roof was bowed in from where the garage had settled from the termite damage and the constant vibration from the commuter train over the years. I installed a natural gas stove with a large tank outside to feed it, but they later took it out because, the natural gas tank made them feel uncomfortable. I also installed the heavier gauge wiring I think 10 instead of 14 or vice a versa. Basically I was paid about \$8,000 or \$1.15 an hour for the work back in 1982 from April 1982 to February 1983, when I tried to move to Norway with my earnings. I was in such pain with my arthritis, I was taking 8 to 10 Tylenol arthritis pain pills a day to do the work. So if you divide 8000 by 1.15 equals about 7000 hour work. I still have the time slips that I kept track of. However, since they were family friends, and since I had stayed in the daughters apartment in Manhattan for about a year and a half, I was also doing it to pay them back. However, having done it, I lost all interest in construction, because it was too painful for me personally with arthritis. There is also low water pressure in the kitchen, since the cast iron pipes through the solid poured concrete foundation underneath the powder room downstairs that they the kitchen water was connected to had very low water pressure because they were rusted. I sometimes thought there might be an old vintage Mercedes hidden in the maid room bathroom foundation. It did not make sense why somebody would pour such a large solid foundation of about 5 foot by 10 foot and four to six feet deep, unless something was hidden in it. However, possibly it was to reduce vibration from the commuter

trains, which one does not notice after time. What the resident of the house never seemed to notice was how many thousands of people got off the train there, and loitered around the train station until the returned train came by on its return. I even recall reading the local paper out there that a member of the Kennedy family was married out there while I was working out there. I do not recall which one, because there are so many of them. CIO

I went out after the last note. I helped a neighbor get her car started which barely started without a jump start, and then I rocked it a bit to get it unstuck out of the ice and snow, and then I parked it in the adjacent cleared parking space. I chatted with another neighbor. I then went downtown, and I stopped by the ATM machine at the Greenwich Avenue branch of Putnam Trust Bank of New York, and I deposited the \$15 PNY memory rebate check, and then I walked the entire length of Greenwich Avenue and the train station area. I walked by the Lexus dealership, and I viewed the bright red Lexus IS | Overview 250 that they had in their showroom window. It looks quite sporty, and it looks like a very practical car. The Lexus dealership maintenance garage here is opened 24 hours a day on weekdays, since they do a lot of leasing work. The Greenwich train station is warm and comfortable when it is opened. They were having another small peace demonstration in front of the Greenwich Post Office with about 24 people attending. I stopped by CVS, and I bought a 16 ounce jar of lightly salted dry roasted CVS peanuts for \$1.99. I sat on the bench across the street from the Gingerman restaurant, and I ate about 1/6th of the peanuts. I then completed my walk, and I sat out for a while. I then used the bathroom at Starbucks. I told them about there being a Starbucks at the Forbidden Palace in Peking, China. I think the Forbidden Palace has 9,999 rooms, so they must have run short on money to make it an even 10,000, so I guess one could considered the adjacent Starbucks, the 10,000th room. I next drove down by the waterfront, and I viewed the cold damp view of Long Island Sound this time of year. The lights still seem to be on out on Long Island. I then went by the Greenwich Automotive Services Exxon gasoline station, and I bought \$9 self service premium gasoline for \$3.139 a gallon for 38.2 miles driving in the last nine days at an average of 13.4 miles per gallon driving an average of 11 miles per hour. I then went by the Stop and Shop, and I chatted with somebody from Corsica and another person from Jamaica. I bought a six pack of boneless breasts of chicken for \$1.69 a pound for \$5.36 and two Chiquita bananas for .54 a pound for .42 for \$5.78 total. I then returned home, and I chatted with a relative. I was out of seasoned bread crumbs, so I took a four ounce tube of Ritz premium crackers, and I threw them in the Cuisine Art with a generous amount of Old Bay Seasoning, garlic powder, chicken and meat seasoning, ground black pepper, and Oregano, and I ground them into bread crumbs, and I put them in the 4C seasoned bread crumb container. I opened up the package of six boneless chicken breasts, and I put four of them in a large flat Rubbermaid container. I then rinsed off the other two in cold water, and I dried them with a paper towel. I then put a thin coat of olive oil in a Pyrex pie dish, and

on a separate plate, I rubbed the bottom side of the boneless chicken breasts with olive oil, and then I spread a thick coating of Ritz seasoned bread crumbs on it, and then I did the same with the top side and the other boneless chicken breasts. I then put them in the Pyrex pie dish, and I baked them in the Farberware convection oven at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 35 minutes. I also made up a batch of http://www.geocities.com/mikelscott/mlsrice.htm to which I also added two teaspoons of Kikkoman soy sauce and Old Bay Seasoning and chicken bullion seasoning. I ate half, and I put the other half in a Rubbermaid container in the refrigerator. My weight has gone down from 195 pounds to 181 pounds, which is a much better weight for my thin boned six foot tall frame. I went out after the last message. I went by Gateway Auto Machine, and I bought a Stant locking gasoline cap #10501 with two keys for my 1992 Buick Roadmaster station wagon for \$22.73 and two quarts of Castrol 10W-40 motor oil for \$3 each and \$1.02 tax for \$30.45 total. I then installed the new locking gasoline cap on my car fuel tank. I put the non locking one in the Stant box, and I put it with the two quarts of oil in the rear driver's side compartment. I put one of the keys on my key ring with the www.gm.com and www.buick.com keys, and when I got home, I put the other gas cap key with the other set of keys. I next went by Charles Stuttig's lock smith on Greenwich Avenue, but they are closed on Saturdays. I will get another set of keys made later on next week, so I have a third set of keys. I then parked, and I sat out briefly down in the center of town. It seems to be busy as ever. I then went down by the waterfront, and there were a few people down there, but I guess the fisherman can not afford to show up anymore. I then went by the Greenwich Library, and I chatted with some of the staff. I then went by the Greenwich Automotive Services Exxon gasoline station, and I bought \$8 of self service premium unleaded gasoline at \$3.559 a gallon for 2.249 gallons purchased. Since I drove locally in traffic 20.5 miles since I last filled up two days ago, my math says I get 9.115 miles per gallon of gasoline in local driving which costs \$.3904 a mile to drive the car locally. I am suppose to get 16 miles per gallon on the highway. On the

diseased 1995 Volvo Turbo wagon, I got 13 to 16 miles per gallon driving locally, so the Buick wagon uses about 50% more gasoline. Maybe I should just fly the Saudi Arabian flag from its back window, but then I would not be able to see out the rear window. Thus the Volvo cost about .22 to .26 miles per gallon to drive locally. However, I only drive about 3,000 miles a year, which works out on the Buick 3,000 divided by 9.115 equals 329.1278 gallons of premium self service gasoline at the current Exxon price of \$3.559 a gallon to \$1,171,365 a year in gasoline expenses with more that likely expected fuel increases for the next year. In the year 2006, I spent \$531.13 on gasoline with mostly local driving and one round trip to Kennebunkport, Maine, so it would seem that my future gasoline expenses for this upcoming year will be 2.2 times greater or about a 110% increase in cost. Since gasoline or fuel prices or a primary variable in the costs of every other item that has to be shipped, it would seem to me that the Federal Government should increase my COLA or Cost of Living Adjustment for my Supplement Security Income from the current 1.5% to a more realistic level. Obviously the politicians do not know what economists are, or they do not listen to them. Thus since part of my volunteer activity over the last 24 years has included observation downtown along with all of the walking that I have done, it will cost me 5 to 7 miles round trip every time I got downtown with 7 miles going as far as Steamboat Road or \$2 to \$2.80 for each round trip, which is why I do not always go downtown, as often anymore. Hopefully the Buick battery will not run down when it is not used daily in the winter, since I do not think it has an alarm system, so possibly I will not have to take it for longer drives to charge up the car battery in the winter. I seasoned it all some more with dried parsley, Italian seasoning, Old Bay Seasoning, Chicken and Meat Seasoning, ground black pepper, garlic powder, and beef bullion powder, and I added about four tablespoons of extra virgin olive oil, a tablespoons of Angostura bitters, a couple of tablespoons of Lea and Perris Worcestershire sauce, a tablespoon of Sesame oil, and about an 1/8th of a cup of Kikkoman soy sauce, a couple of tablespoons of lemon juice, and I mixed it all together with a large wooden mixing spoon that I have. I left it on medium high electric burner heat, and I let it all cook stirring frequently for about 50 minutes. I made up a batch of http://www.geocities.com/mikelscott/mlsrice.htm, but instead of using water, I used a 14 ounce can of Swanson's chicken broth, and I also added to the regular recipe,

Once the rice was done, after the 50 minute cooking cycle of the stew, I added the rice to the mixture, and I mixed it all together, and I continued to cook it another 30 minutes reducing the electric burner heat gradually to medium and then low for a simmer. After it was done, I put 1.5 cups of the mixture in a soup bowl. I put three cups of the mixture in each of three Rubbermaid containers with lids. I froze two of the containers, and I put the third in the refrigerator. I clean up as I cook, so I just cleaned up the Wok, and then I rubbed the inside with a bit of olive oil with a paper towel, so it would not rust. Thus I made up all together seven 1.5 cup servings of the stew. I then ate the portion in the soup bowl with a glass of iced tea. It is a very hearty enjoyable meal, particularly, if you do not have to cook it. CIO

I then threw out some garbage, and I picked up my mail. I made my bed, and I washed the breakfast dishes. I chatted with Greenwich Automotive Services Exxon station, and they were just completing the work on my car. I will get into that in a minute. I chatted with a relative a friend a couple of times. I then walked downtown to pickup the car. I stopped by the Chase Bank on West Putnam Avenue. I stopped by McDonalds on the way to use the bathroom. I picked up my car at the Greenwich Automotive Services Exxon station, and I paid \$109.99 for a new Deka car battery and \$13.75 to have the electric system tested and have the battery installed, \$38.58 for an oil and filter change, top off vital fluids, lubricate chassis and perform 20 point maintenance check. The \$38.58 included \$19.58 labor, five quarts of Exxon 5000 motor oil for \$14.05 and a #49 oil filter for \$4.95. Emissions test \$20 and free tire rotation for \$200 total. I also need a new drive belt installed which would be \$150. I also need to have the automatic transmission flushed and refilled which would be \$200. I also need new wiper blades which would be about \$28. Thus with tax, I still need about \$800 in service that I can not afford. A relative paid for the \$200 of work that they did perform. I then checked the air on the tires again for 35 PSI rear and 30 PSI front. I then went downtown, and I walked the entire length of Greenwich Avenue and the train station area. I stopped by the Greenwich Cigar store, and I bought for a dollar an Aces High scratch card, but I lost. I stopped by CVS, and I bought buy one get one free of Arm and Hammer detergent for \$5.49 both and .33 tax for \$5.82 total. After my walk, I sat out for a while. I was told if I added the Isopropyl dry gas additive, it would help me pass my emissions test, but first I had to drive the car on the highway a few miles at 70 miles per hour. I then got on I-95 East at Exit 3 in downtown Greenwich, and I drove from 50 to 70 miles an hour to exit 5 and back to exit 3. I then parked downtown. I left the engine running while at the Stop and Shop to charge up the car battery. I then parked downtown, and I walked the entire length of Greenwich Avenue and the train station area. I sat out at various locations. At the vacant lot at the top of Greenwich Avenue south of the Pickwick Plaza, they have a back hoe, so maybe they will be doing some new construction there. Note: <888> 04/22/07 Sunday 9:45 P.M.: I opened up a 12 ounce box of frozen Gorton's Gorton's Shrimp Temptations, and I put it in a two quart pot, and I added a 26 ounce jar of Francesco Rinaldi Welcome to Francesco Rinaldi tomato sauce with sliced mushrooms and peppers, and I added four cloves of minced garlic, a teaspoon of olive oil, and a teaspoon of Italian spices, and I brought it to a simmer over medium high electric burner heat stirring frequently to defrost the shrimp and mix the ingredients together, and I reduced it to medium electric burner heat and for the last five minute of a 20 minute cooking cycle, I put it on medium low. A relative is going to send the friend a check for the car, and I will use the insurance check to pay back the relative for the Volvo. My friend showed me some of the oddities of the car. We chatted briefly with a neighbor. I showed my friend the current state of the apartment, since he had not been here in two years. I filled out the bill of sale on his registration and he signed it. We are going to leave it registered in his name and insured in his name, until I get up the Connecticut department of motor vehicles later on next week. I need to have enough money to pay the sales tax on it. Although, I am buying the car for a \$1,000, the book value is about \$2,500, so they might charge me 6% sales tax on \$2,500 or about \$150 plus title transfer and license plate transfer fees. I made copies of the registration for him and myself, and we put his insurance card and registration back in the car glove box. I still have his plates on the car. I drove my friend to the Greenwich Railroad station to catch a 3:01 P.M. train headed east. He had somebody to pick him up at his destination. The automatic transmission was repaired under warranty at 55,000 miles, and I was with him when it broke down coming down from Kennebunkport, Maine many years ago. The brakes were replaced at 85,000 miles. The tires show about 2/3rds tread left on them. The car is very clean. The car has a boat hitch, which my friend will continue to use the car to take his boat in and out of the water twice a year. Using premium high grade octane gasoline, the car only gets about 16 miles per gallon the highway and about the same locally. The car was tuned a short time ago, after it was tuned its gasoline mileage went from 26 miles per gallon to about 16 miles per gallon, so perhaps mileage can be improved. To fill up the tank will cost over \$50. Still it is very good reliable transportation for me, since I only drive about 3,000 miles a year. I oiled the door hinges and locks. The tail gate window

would not open properly, and I took a piece of plastic bag out the latch area, and it now seems to work fine. When I returned home, the driver's side window would not go up quickly, but eventually the power window went up with a a push and a lift on it. I used a nut and bolt to fasten the open end of the air intake to its fixed position on the front of the car underneath the hood. I checked the lights. The small front passenger side blinker bulb needs to be replaced. I took it out to match it. I had to fish out the other bulb at that location and reinstall in its lens housing. I turned the dash lights, so they come on with the head lights. The car still needs to be vacuumed. It has a third rear seat folded down. It is a quite large deluxe car. My friend knows of several people with the same car with over 200,000 miles. I think it cost about \$29,000 new, and it was one of the demos from the Buick Open sold at Putnam Buick here in Greenwich. It has rear wheel drive, so it is not very good on snow. It has a rear Putnam Buick license frame, which my friend says makes me look "Old Guard". The remote keyless entry key fob had two dead lithium disk #2016 batteries in it, and I put in two #2025 batteries in it, and it works just fine. It is missing one piece of black rubber side molding from one of the front doors, and the other piece for the other side is in the rear compartment area. They could be glued back on. I also closed up the rear inside side hatch door which had its latch mechanism slide back a bit, so I pulled it forward, and it worked to close it. It might need a new air filter, I am not sure. Although the car is quite clean on the inside and the outside, the engine compartment is quite dusty after all of these years. The oil is topped up, but it could use a quart or two of coolant antifreeze. Still the car runs just fine, and it is quite powerful and peppy. It has full power and accessories, since it was a deluxe model. I should get floor mats for it, but those might be expensive. It has carpeting in it now that might get dirty. I also put a spare tire valve cap on the passenger side front wheel. The front blinker bulb that needs replacing is in the front seat divider compartment. After tweaking the car, I uninstalled Microsoft Windows Live OneCare from the primary computer, and I put Norton Internet Security 7 back on it, and that fixed the problems I had with the weather pulse program and the Microsoft Money 2006 program not working. My viewpoint with all of the electronics on newer cars it could have been anything, and also when I pushed it out of the water it started up after trying it

about three times. I have three witnesses whom were standing on the hill at the house on the corner just east of the Old Greenwich Presbyterian church, and they watched me go through the process. I keep thinking and hoping that instead of the head gasket that having the leaky coolant overflow hose that it might have cause some sort of system problem, and possibly the ping might be from the engine running roughly when I first started it up, and possibly it skipped a tooth on the timing belt. I drive the 1995 Volvo 850 Turbo station wagon so little, I do not have much of a chance to test it out except for when I drive to Kennebunkport, Maine round trip each summer. The car ran fine going out to Hauppauge, Long Island and back for the Microsoft Conference at the Hyatt Hotel there, so possibly whatever flooded the engine and then restarting it might have caused the problem. think the head gasket is blown because I had foamy oil, but possibly some water got into the oil, and the head gasket might be all right. Also I have put in Sunoco, Castrol, Exxon, and Mobil oil in the car in filling it up more frequently than I should have to. I thought the car was burning more oil locally. However, when the oil was changed in Kennebunkport, Maine last July 2006 at the Sunoco station there, I noticed on my trip down from Maine, it consumed over 2.5 quarts of oil, but no antifreeze. They put in a NAPA oil filter, and there was oil on the ground underneath my car for most of the last year, so possibly I thought I had an oil leak somewhere in the car or from the NAPA oil filter. The car did not burn oil going up to Maine, except the usual consumption of about a half quart, so something happened in Kennebunkport, Maine last July 2006 to cause the car to burn more oil, which possibly might have been the Sunoco oil change. However, they only put in 4 quarts of oil, and the car uses about 6 quarts of oil, so possibly they did not fill the oil all the way up at the Sunoco oil change. I have consumed about eight quarts of motor oil since then in about 2,500 miles driving mostly locally. Possibly water got into the oil or the mixture of oil makes it look foamy like the head gasket is blown. The ping sound if it is not the bearing might possibly be water in the fuel system. I could have gotten water in the fuel system when I drove through the flooded area, and a little while before that I had filled up the gasoline tank at the Connecticut - New York Exxon station on the Greenwich border. Possibly with the flooding along the Byram River, water got into their fuel tanks, and that might be possibly causing the pinging sound in the motor. I did have a leak in the antifreeze overflow container hose from the thermostat to the coolant overflow container, which hose I replaced. Although I do not drive too much, I will have to wait until it dries out a bit in this area, and I will have to wait until I fill the tank a couple of times to see if that makes any difference. I will monitor the oil and coolant to see if there are any changes. At least I still have a useable car for local driving. Of course it might take some time to drive enough to see if the car has water in its fuel. I chatted with the building custodian and my next door neighbor. They still have a couple of pictures of hand grenades for sale at the art galley west of the Greenwich Y.M.C.A., but they no longer display them in the window. bad head gasket. They told me that the pinging sound is a bad bearing. They said the catalytic converter was all right, but driving threw the flooded area in Old Greenwich caused the MAF sensor to not work, and it would need to be replaced for about \$300. They said with the bad bearing the head gasket could not simply be replaced, but I would have to replace the whole engine which would cost about \$4,000, which is not worth it. The head gasket problem was a preexisting problem before I drove through the flooded area, so it would not be covered by my automobile insurance. The cheapest solution was to change the oil and oil filter, and flush out the engine with motor additive detergent first and do a motor flush and blow it out with compressed air. I authorized them to do it. I chatted with two relatives, and I went back to bed. I was called again at 11:30 A.M. that the car was ready. I walked back to the Exxon garage next to the Greenwich Library, and I was splashed a few times by traffic on the highway. I chatted with another regular walker and waterfront observer on the way. He tried to interest me in buying a Ferrari while we walked by their dealership. I stopped for a cigarette break outside the Stop and Shop. A relative paid for the car repair. I picked up the car.

I then returned home. The car seemed to be running the same as before, but it has the pinging sound from the bad bearing. I chatted with some neighbors and the building custodian. I then went out, and I went by Gateway Auto Supply, and I bought a 15 ounce container of STP STP® - Fuel & Oil Additives oil treatment for \$3.99. I was told that apparently there is a lot of snow up north. Earlier this morning, I chatted with a friend on Long Island, and they do have electricity out there. I put the STP oil treatment in the engine oil, and I saved the STP container in the rear of the car, and I returned home. The car seems to be running pretty much the way it did before I drove through the flooded area. The Check Engine light is no long coming on, so maybe changing the oil fixed the MAF sensor. I was told that if I drive it locally, the car might last six months or more, but I was told not to drive it on the highway. Thus I will not be able to drive it to Maine this summer for vacation. I was told that with the blown head gasket, I should change the oil more frequently with the antifreeze mixing into the oil. I will have to monitor antifreeze and oil consumption. I picked up my mail, and I chatted with a neighbor. I am having a hard time sleeping, so maybe I will stay awake a while longer. CIO

There was high water over a foot deep by the Cos Cob fire station at the road intersection. The Cos Cob fire station responded to a

number of calls including a call where they brought a rubber boat. I then put each comforter in its own separate dryer, and I put three quarters or .75 each in each for 21 minutes drying time. One dryer was not working properly, so I had to put another .50 in another machine to dry the other comforter, when I discovered it was not dry. Thus the laundry cost \$6. I then decided to check out the conditions in Old Greenwich. Instead of driving in the main way by the Walgreens intersection, I turned by St. Catherine's Church, and I took the back way. However, the area at the rotary in front of the Old Greenwich Presbyterian Church had about a foot of water, and it was not blocked off. My car stalled out in the middle of the small pond about 500 yards in diameter. I got out of the car, but water did not come into the car, so it was less than a foot deep. I was wearing my low L.L. Bean boots, but they filled up with water. I left the car in neutral, and I was able to push it further eastward until it was in a few inches of water, and I was able to drive it out with it sputtering, and I parked by CVS in Old Greenwich. The Check Engine light is now on indicating something wrong with the emissions system. There is a sputtering sound like there might be an exhaust leak. I checked the fuses to make sure none of them was blown. None of the other warning lights come on. However, the EMS light comes on when one starts the car, and one has to turn back the ignition key a fraction to get it to go out so the lights work, which they do not if it is on. I saw trucks going down to the shoreline in Old Greenwich and large front end loader machines, so there must be flooding down there. I returned back via the main road which is not flooded by Binney Park, and the area by the Greenwich High School is still flooded, so I went from Exit 4 to Exit 3 o I-95. I stopped by the Exxon station, and there is no way to drop the car off at night. I think they will be busy tomorrow, so I will take it by on Tuesday, if the "Check Engine" light still comes on after the car dries out a bit. Possibly I got some water in the exhaust system, but I would think it would have dried out by now. The Check Engine light means an Emissions problem. Everything else on the car seems to run fine, but it did hesitate a bit on the highway at a higher speeds coming back. I changed into dry socks, and I hung my wet clothes out to dry. I put each of the two clean comforters back on either far end of the couches to have available until warmer weather arrives. If the Catalytic converter separated it should be covered under warranty, since that was replaced this past summer at the Greenwich Automotive Exxon Service station next to the **Greenwich Library. A thermal anomaly was noted on April 02-10.

volcano on April 04, 08-09. A thermal anomaly over the volcano was noted on April 04-05 and 07-10.

However, I think bilge pumps on boats have about 1.25 inch inside diameter hoses, but the only Marine supply stores, I know of around up here are in Norwalk, Connecticut, and Bliss Marine has not been in Darien, Connecticut for about a decade. This is .25 inch two large 1-1/2 Bilge Pump Hose per foot - SHOP.COM, but it might work or this 1-1/8 Bilge Pump Hose per foot - SHOP.COM or Overton's - Maintenance > Hoses & Fittings: Water Hoses, Bilge Pump Hoses, Exhaust Hoses, Fuel Hoses. Of course it is a 3 to 4 inch replacement, and on the hoses shown, although one could take a 1.5 inch inside diameter hose, and cut slits in its ends lengthwise to reduced the diameter before using the hose clamps, one would still have to cut out the old accordion piece with a hack saw which might be difficult, and I do not want to wreck the existing configuration until I know I have the parts and the tools and funds to do it. I might be able to use my serrated bread knife to cut out the old piece, but once one reaches the hard plastic, one would really need a hack saw to remove it, if the hack saw would fit into the location. A tree pruning saw might do the trick however. However, when I remember it, I might checked the Greenwich Hardware store greenwichhardware Website . For now the silver duct tape is working just fine on the hair line cracks in the accordion section from the original part. CIO

There might be a part that one can use to fix it with accordion flex with inside tube diameter of 1.25 inches about four inches long. Of course, one might hope Volvo still has the hole part with the accordion unit, but knowing what cars parts and auto labor cost, it would be an expensive repair that is probably not

necessary. Obviously other older Volvos of the same vintage would have had the problem, so maybe they make a repair piece with the accordion flex section. I turned off the server which has a 500 watt power supply, so that saves 1200 watts and the dolphin florescent light which uses about a 100 watts for 1300 watts savings. I currently am running 70 watt energy saving bulbs which use 13 watts in the kitchen stove area, and 6 of them in the living room and one in the hallway for 8 X 13 watts for 104 watts plus the four 25 watt sconce bulbs above the dining table for 100 watts plus the 20 watt bulb in the elephant light for about 224 watts of regular light usage. Of course I have to turn on the lights in the bathroom and the bedroom occasionally. The bedroom lights are the energy saving 13 watt bulbs. I also run a 500 watt power supply in the primary computer when it is turned on along with a 19 inch and 20 inch CRT monitor which are probably about 600 watts when running and there are the routers and network switch and the computer monitor light which is probably about another 100 watts, so when I am running the primary computer, I am probably using 1200 watts of electricity. Of course when it is cooler I still use the electric blanket at night. I also have to run the refrigerator which I have set to a warmer setting. I also have a half size hot water tank, but I only take showers for less than three minutes, and I turn off the water when I am lathering with soap and hair conditioner, so it might be more like two minute showers. The electric heat is totally turned off in the apartment. Of course cooking uses the microwave oven and stove top burners. Well, it is quieter in the apartment without the Honeywell air purifier going and the Epox server, but it will not smell as good. I probably should quit cooking onions with the hamburgers. I also turn on the kitchen stove fan, when I am smoking by

it. Of course when it it gets wamer outside, I will have to use the air conditioner. Now to my email. CIO

From the front side of the bench on the back, I secured the top right of the back and bottom right of the bench back with two 3 inch hose clamps, and I used two 2.5 inch hose clamps connected together for the center right back to give it extra support. One the left side from the front, I use a pair of two 2.5 inch hose clamps connected together on the upper left back and the lower left back to give it extra support. The left side had not broken yet. I left the bench on the sidewalk, so it is more stable, and so one does not get their feet dirty sitting in the mud on the once grassy area on the side of the sidewalk against the building wall. I chatted with a Greenwich Housing Authority official at the Arnold Bread Store outlet, and I briefed him on what I had been doing. I also chatted with some neighbors. I will now reheat the spaghetti dinner that I had left over yesterday on three vegetable cycles in the General Electric microwave oven, and I will put it on a large dinner plate with a couple of tablespoons of grated parmesan cheese on it, and I will eat it with a glass of iced tea. Note:<888> 04/02/07 Monday 7:50 A.M.: Instead of sewing up the hem on the bottom end of the comforter, I had a package of 50 one inch Singer Bobby or Safety

pins that I had gotten from CVS on Greenwich Avenue about a year ago, I used about 16 of them about six inches apart to close up the bottom hem on the comforter. Thus one can remove the stuffing and just wash the comforter cover in the future which should fit into a regular washing machine which would be cheaper and easier to do. I am letting it air dry a little bit on the bed before I fold it up, and put it away in in its plastic holder. I recall buying it from the Greenwich Hospital Thrift Shop for about \$35 new six years ago. It smells very nice with the Tide detergent perfume. However, it should be totally dry before one puts it away, so it does not get mildew. I also put my new www.geico.com insurance card for the next six months in the glove compartment automobile papers holder. GEICO still has not taken my automobile car insurance payment off of my bank account yet, but as I recall the new policy does not start until April 8, 2007. I will now run out briefly to the Arnold Bread outlet to get some English muffins. I have to wait until the mail arrives today to pay my apartment rent if the rent bill comes. CIO

Note: <888> 04/02/07 Monday 7:15 A.M.: I went out after the last message, and I went to the Cos Cob all night Laundromat across the street from the Cos Cob Starbucks. You could hear the sound of Jazz coming from Starbucks in Cos Cob while they were cleaning up the place. They also play jazz at the Starbucks on Greenwich Avenue. The French people like Jazz. I put the larger comforter in a large 60 pound capacity washer machine which costs \$5.25, and I put a capful of Tide www.tide.com in the prewash holder on top and two caps of liquid Tide in the primary wash holder on top, and I started the machine with \$5.25 in quarters I got from the change machine. I put it on heavy soil, and the cycle ran 25 minutes. While the comforter was being washed, I drove over to the Riverside Shopping Plaza, and I got some cash, so I could get some more change for drying. I also bought two 1.06 ounce containers of Gold Emblem Italian seasoning for .66 each for \$1.32 total. The pharmacy at the CVS store at the Riverside Shopping Plaza is opened all night. I did 21 minutes of dry time on hot which only cost .75, and the comforter was almost dry. The bottom lining on the comforter came apart, so I had to refit the stuffing inside of it, and I folded it up, and I put it in the car. While waiting for the dry cycle, I chatted with a Whole Foods trucker mailing a letter at the post office next door. I explained to the trucker that I can not afford to buy organic produce, and from what I have heard they still use DDT in Mexico where some of our produce comes from. I then went downtown, and I walked the entire length of Greenwich Avenue and the train station area. I used the ATM machine at the Chase Bank on Central Greenwich Avenue. I used the bathroom at Starbucks, and I chatted with their morning staff. I returned home, and I brought up the comforter. I diluted the half remaining container of full strength antifreeze coolant, so it is now 50% to 50% mixture. I topped up the Volvo antifreeze overflow coolant container, so it is full, and the coolant light does not come on in the car. I spread the comforter out on the bed, and shortly I have to sew up by hand the six foot seam that came apart at the bottom. I have enough thread. I will leave it out to dry a little bit more today, since it is still a bit moist. The comforter stuffing is a synthetic that dried faster than the outside fabric. My www.newegg.com payments have cleared the bank, so I no longer owe them anything. The cigarette and the

Cablevision payments have also cleared the bank. Now to sewing the comforter hem. CIO
